Beating the Bounds in North Bovey

Beating the bounds' is an ancient custom still observed in parts of England, Wales, and the New England area of the United States, which traditionally involves residents of the parish, deliberately including children, walking the parish boundary and swatting local landmarks or boundary markers on the parish boundary with branches (often willow canes), or sometimes even 'bouncing' the children on the markers, in order to maintain a shared mental map and knowledge of the parish boundary, usually every seven years.

The North Bovey Fair will start at 2 pm on Saturday 20th July on The Green. There will be a variety of stalls – including bric-à-brac, pre-loved clothing, bottle stall, books and cakes. The Dog Show will begin at 2.30 and there will be the usual Duck Race on the River Bovey at 4. Throughout the afternoon delicious teas will be served in the Parish Hall, and there will be competitions for photography and displays in the church. And for a bird's eye view, you might want to go on a trip up the church tower and see the village from on high!

The election ceremony marks the official acceptance by the Church of England in Devon of the monarch's chosen candidate. The process has remained largely unchanged since it was established by King John in 1214.
